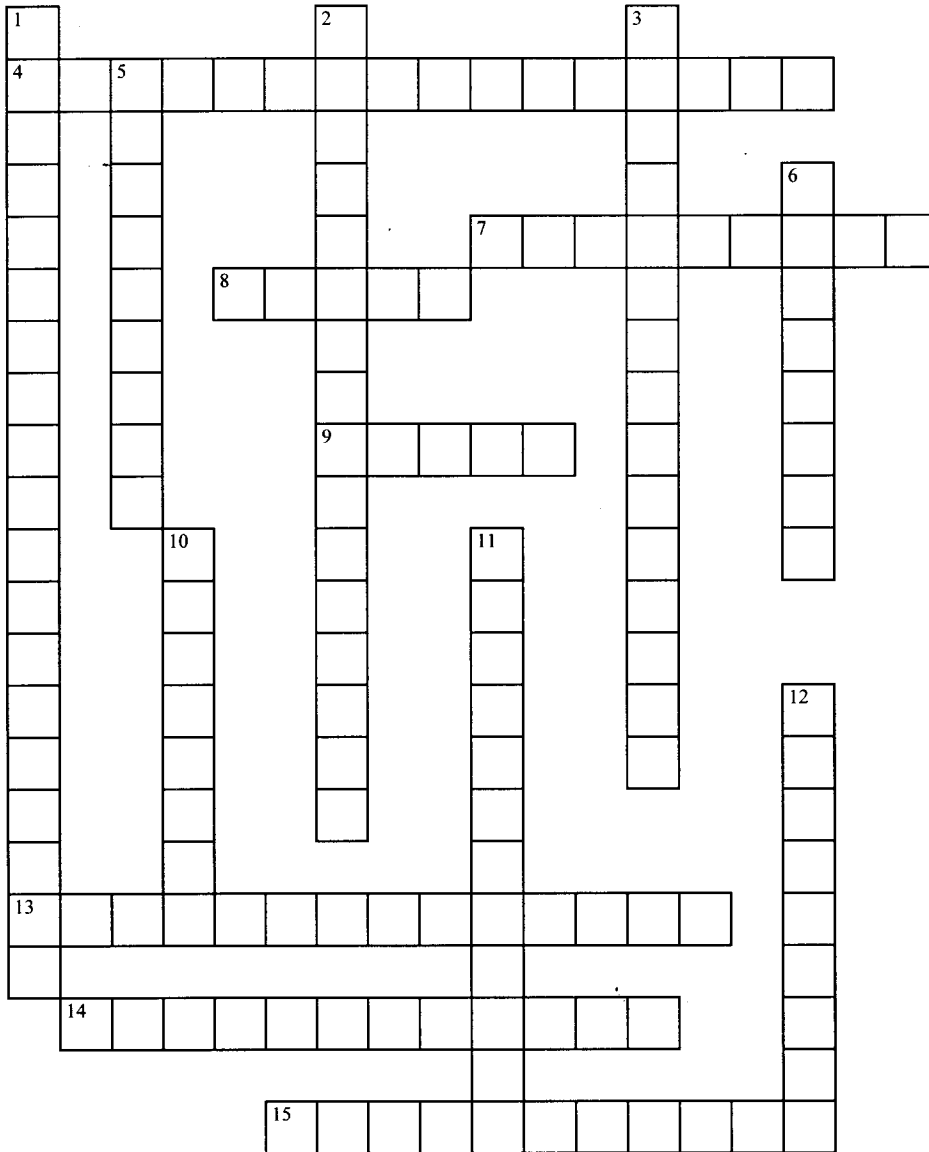


Faces of Denver

- 4 WHEN THIS MAN ARRIVED IN COLORADO IN 1925, HIS FATHER-IN-LAW REPORTEDLY GAVE HIM THE CITY DUMP. AFTER WORLD WAR II, HE CLEANED IT UP AND DEVELOPED CHERRY CREEK SHOPPING CENTER THERE.
- 7 A LARGE NUMBER OF HISPANIC FAMILIES ARRIVED IN DENVER AROUND THE EARLY 1900S AFTER BEING ENLISTED TO HARVEST FOR THIS COLORADO INDUSTRY.
- 8 HUNGARIAN FREEDOM PARK WAS

- 1 THE CATHEDRAL BASILICA OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION AT 1530 LOGAN STREET IS THOUGHT TO BE THE STRUCTURE WITH THE MOST OF THESE IN THE UNITED STATES.
- 2 A FOUNDATION AND SEVERAL DENVER ATTRACTIONS ARE NAMED AFTER THIS GERMAN IMMIGRANT WHO ONCE SOLD HARDWARE TO MINERS AND EVENTUALLY MADE MILLIONS OF DOLLARS IN VENTURES INCLUDING SUGAR-PROCESSING AND CEMENT-MAKING.

DEDICATED IN 1968 AT EMERSON STREET AND THIS BOULEVARD.

- 9 BY 1890, DENVER WAS THE THIRD LARGEST CITY IN THE WEST, AFTER SAN FRANCISCO AND THIS PLACE.
- 13 THIS FORMER MAYOR'S FAMILY BROUGHT HIM TO DENVER WHEN HE WAS 5 YEARS OLD, HOPING THE CLIMATE WOULD HELP TAME HIS ASTHMA.
- 14 THE BLUEBIRD THEATER, ORIGINALLY NAMED THOMPSON THEATER, WAS SUCH A SUCCESSFUL MOVIE HOUSE THAT THE OPERATORS EXPANDED TO OPEN THIS VENUE IN 1917.
- 15 MANUAL HIGH SCHOOL'S ORIGINAL NICKNAME FOR THE SCHOOL'S ATHLETIC TEAMS.
- 3 THIS MAN WAS A FREQUENT GUEST AT HIS SISTER'S HOME AT 2932 LAFAYETTE STREET, WHERE HE DIED IN 1917.
- 5 THIS SLOAN'S LAKE BEACH FEATURED A ZOO, ROLLER COASTER, SKATING RINK AND THEATER BEFORE BEING BURNED DOWN IN 1890 AND 1908 FIRES.
- 6 RICHTOFEN CASTLE ON 12TH AVENUE WAS BUILT BY THE UNCLE AND GODFATHER OF THIS WORLD WAR I FLYING ACE.
- 10 IN 1887, BARON ALLOIS GILLAUME EUGENE VON WINCKLER PLATTED THIS AREA, BORDERED BY TODAY'S COLORADO BOULEVARD, DAHLIA STREET, MONTVIEW BOULEVARD AND 26TH AVENUE.
- 11 THE LAND THAT DENVER FOUNDER WILLIAM LARIMER STAKED OUT IN 1858 AS MOUNT PROSPECT CEMETERY IS NOW BETTER KNOWN AS THIS.
- 12 SOME 36 YEARS AFTER DENVER CITY, AURARIA AND HIGHLAND CONSOLIDATED INTO DENVER IN 1860, THIS TOWN WAS ANNEXED TO THE CITY TOO.
