**Dear Firearms Activist:**

**The Firearms Coalition of Colorado is working for you!**

**At the Colorado State Legislature, we have some very good pro-gun bills moving toward passage, and we need your help to put them through.**

**HB 1305 (Rep. McPherson/Sen. Dennis)** is pre-emption by the State of most local gun control ordinances. It has passed the House and is out of Committee in the Senate. It is up for second reading on the Senate floor. We are trying to improve it. Support Sen. Dennis' efforts!

**HB 1316 (Rep. Dean/Sen. Chlouber)** is the best Right to Carry concealed bill yet. It has everything gun owners want and contains what Gov. Owens has said that he will sign - N.I.C.S. check that will exempt permit holders from Brady background checks, and training (Hunter Safety course will be sufficient).

**SB 205 (Sen. Teck/Rep. Clapp)** is out of Committee in the Senate and up for second reading on the Senate floor. It prohibits any municipality or the State from suing any firearms manufacturer like the tobacco companies have had to fight.

**After you have read this, phone, fax or e-mail your State Senator and Representative and give your support for these bills! Their Phone numbers are on the backs of each flyer. If you do not know the names of your elected officials, call your County Clerk & Recorder and they can tell you.**

## New Right To Carry bill will carry the day

### HOUSE BILL 1316 BEST YET

A new concealed carry bill, HB-1316 Sponsored by Representatives Doug Dean, Brad Young and Jack Taylor plus Senator Ken Chlouber is moving forward.

### Sheriffs in, Chiefs out

The Sheriffs will issue the Right to Carry (RTC) permits taking the Police Chiefs out of the picture except for places like Denver where they don't have a Sheriff.

### Shall issue

It is a 'shall issue' bill instead of the present 'may' issue. If you can possess a firearm under Federal Law and Colorado State Law, you can get an RTC permit. That means that if you are an honest, stable citizen, you can get an RTC permit. If you are a felon, a fugitive, illegal alien, insane, convicted of domestic violence, etc. forget it. If you have been charged and found not guilty or had the charges dismissed for an offense that would prevent your from owning a firearm, you had better check your record.

### Starts in less than 6 months

It will take effect September 1, 1999. If you have a permit issued before July 1, 1999 it is good through June 30, 2000 or to the normal expiration date if it expires prior to July 1, 1999.

### Moderate cost every five years

The fee for both the initial permit and renewals are to reflect the actual direct and/or indirect cost. This is not to exceed \$100. The permit will be

good for five years, and will provide privacy from FBI record keeping when you buy a gun.

### Age and residency

You must be 21 years old and a legal resident of the state of Colorado. Members of the Armed Forces and members of their immediate family stationed at military installations in Colorado are considered legal residents.

### Training

You must furnish a training certificate from a handgun training class, hunter safety course, or a certificate showing honorable discharge from military service that reflects pistol qualifications obtained within five years prior to the date on which the application is issued.

### Restrictions on carry

A concealed handgun permit does not authorize any person to carry a concealed handgun into any place where the carrying of firearms is prohibited by federal law.

### Circumstances exempt from permit requirements

Any person who may legally possess a handgun may carry a handgun without a permit under the following circumstances; The handgun or a portion of the handgun is sufficiently visible so that a reasonable person is able to determine that it is a handgun, including, but not limited to, a handgun in a holster that is worn outside the clothing. The handgun is in a case, cover, or enclosure designed

specifically for carrying, covering, or protecting the handgun and it is not fastened to the person or clothing of the person carrying the handgun.

The handgun is in the possession of a person who is in a private automobile or some other private means of conveyance and who carries the handgun for any legal use including self defense, or for transportation to and from any other legal activity including but not limited to target shooting or hunting.

### HELP PASS RIGHT TO CARRY

If you want to to get Right to Carry (RTC) then you must get active. Phone and/or write your State Representative. Phone numbers are on the back page.

If you don't know what district you are in, look for your county's listings in the blue pages of your phone book. Call your County Clerk to get the number of the districts you live in. You have three districts; (1) U.S. Congress; (2) Colorado State Senate; (3) Colorado State House. You are concerned with item (3).

When you call or write, tell your Representative you support the right of decent law abiding people to carry guns if they so choose. If you get an answering machine, just leave the same message. It only takes a minute.

## Bill will stop Denver from stealing your vehicle and your firearm

### **DENVER ORDINANCE LEGALIZES PIRACY**

Denver Ordinance 37-50 allows Denver to seize property because of a firearm. This could be your vehicle, a rental vehicle, a hotel or condo.

If the Denver Authorities find a legal firearm in your possession, they can seize the property. The owner of the property doesn't have to be involved with the firearm. In other words, if you are renting a hotel room or condo, it can be seized. If it is a rental vehicle you will have to pay the car rental company for it. Check with your insurance company. Ask them if Denver seizes your car because you broke a Denver Ordinance, will they pay for it? No they won't since you broke the law. Will the finance company let you off the hook? Again, no. You will still have to pay for the car that Denver is now in possession of. You drive

through Denver on the way to a shooting competition, gun show, hunting, etc., you can lose your car. Even if you have a concealed carry permit, Denver can still confiscate your car.

### **OFF TO JAIL AS WELL AS LOSE YOUR CAR**

So far, we've only discussed the property aspects of this ordinance. What happens to you? You can be arrested and spend time in jail. You get to spend thousands of dollars to defend yourself when you have done nothing more serious than drive through Denver with a firearm in a vehicle.

### **HOUSE BILL OVERTURNS DENVER'S ORDINANCE**

House Bill 1305 prohibits any municipality, county, or city and county from adopting any ordinance or resolution

that would impose a greater restriction on a person's ability to own, possess, carry, use, or transfer a firearm than is imposed by state law. It also identifies imposition of a greater penalty as being a greater restriction. It specifies that any ordinance or resolution in existence as of the effective date of the act that violates the provisions of the act shall be deemed unauthorized and unenforceable. It changes the affirmative defenses to the charge of carrying concealed weapons to exceptions.

**Call your State Senator now and tell them to vote for HB-1305**

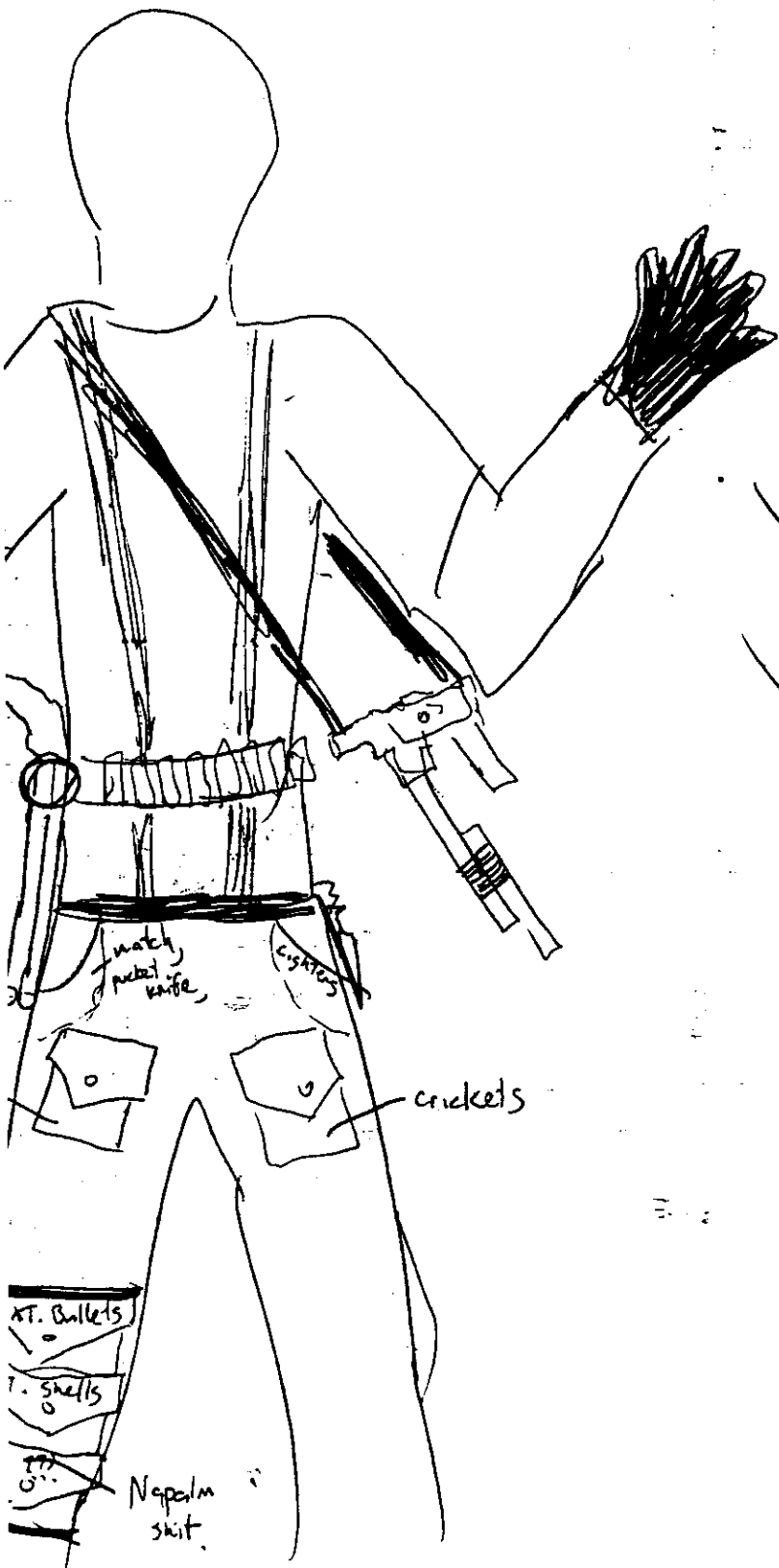

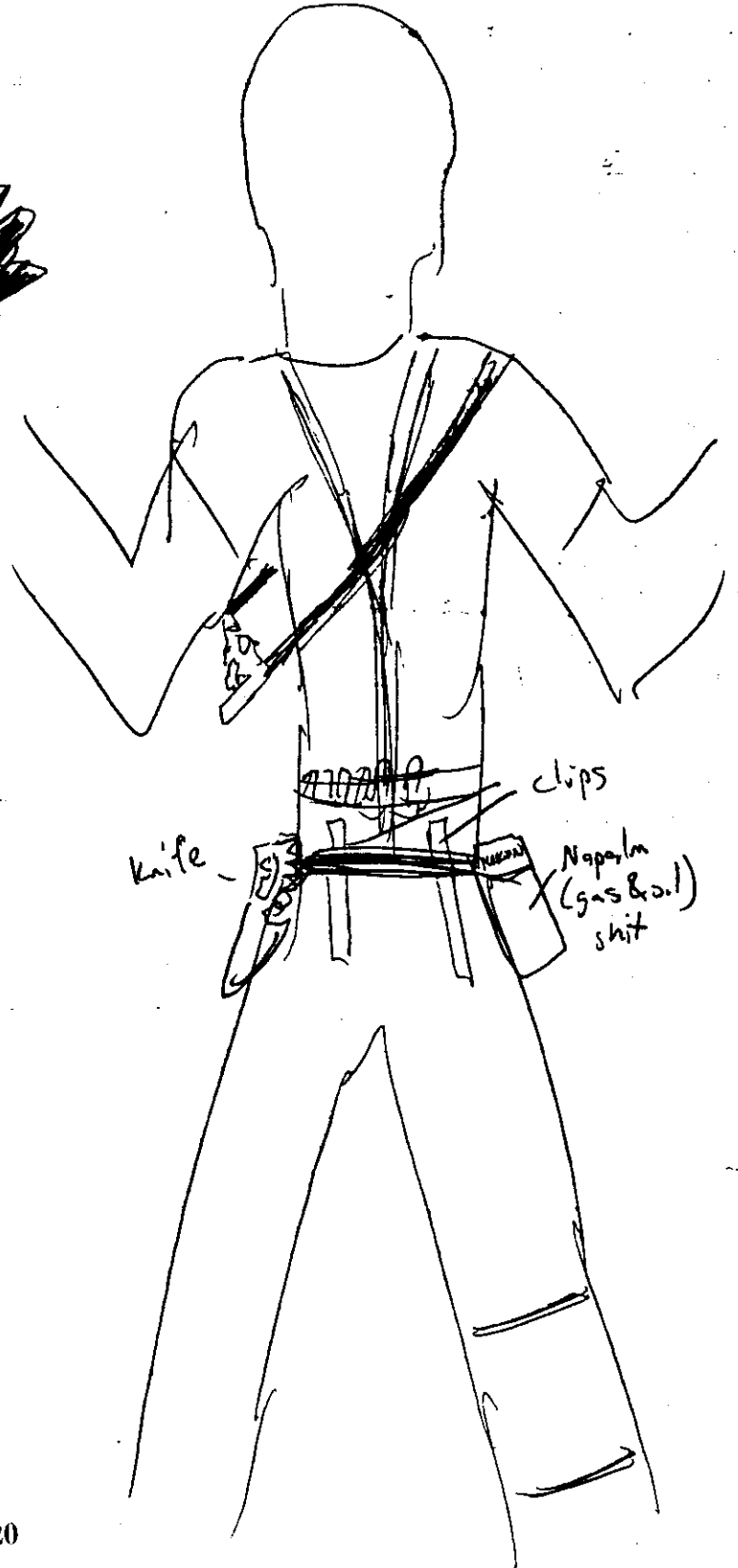

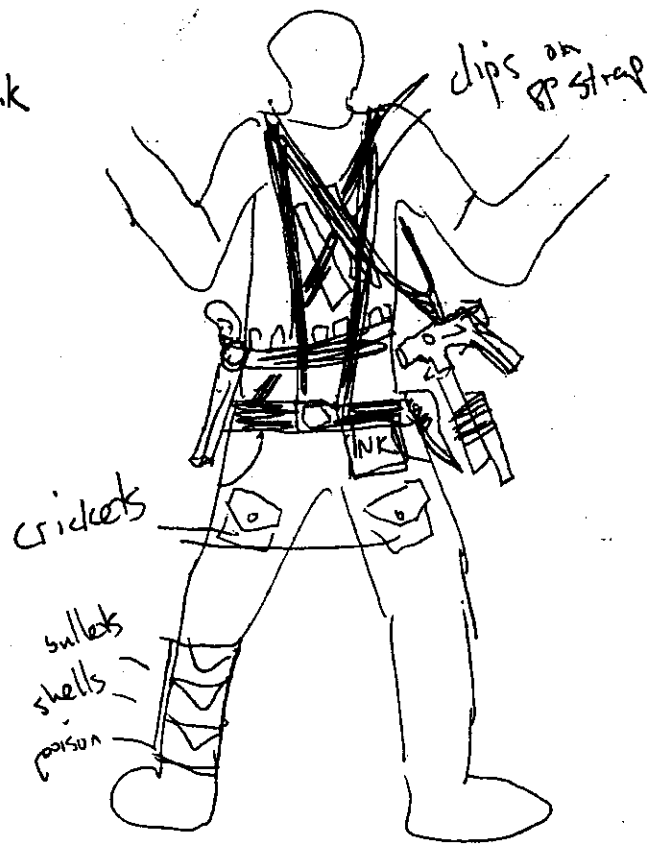

The town, even at 1:00 AM, was still bustling with activity as the man dressed in black walked down the empty streets. The moon was barely visible, hiding under a shield of clouds, adding a chill to the atmosphere. What was most recognized about the man was the sound of his footsteps. Behind the conversations & noises of the town, not a sound was to be heard from him, except the dark, monotonous footsteps, combined with the jingling of his belt chains striking not only the two visible guns, in their holsters, but the large bowie knife, slung in anticipation of use. The wide-brimmed hat cast a pitch-black shadow of his already dimly lit face. He wore black gloves, with a type of metal spiked-band across the knuckles. A black overcoat covered most of his body, small lines of metal & half-inch spikes layering upper portions of the shoulders, arms, and back. His boots were newly polished, and didn't look like they had been used much. He carried a black duffel bag in his right hand. He apparently had parked a car nearby, & looked ready for a small war with whoever came across his way. I have never seen anyone take this mad-max approach in the city, especially since the piggies had been called to this part of town for a series of crimes lately.
